Final decision pursuant to Article 60 under the General Data Protection Regulation

Decision of the Integrity Protection Authority

In accordance with Article 60(8) of the GDPR, the Integrity Protection Authority (IMY) adopts¹ the Norwegian Data Protection Authority's decision in Annex 1, and closes the case.

Grounds for the decision

On 3 January 2026, the complainant lodged his complaint with the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection (IMY). As the case concerns cross-border processing and Rankedin A/S has its main establishment in Norway, IMY submitted the complaint to the Norwegian Data Protection Authority.

The Norwegian Data Protection Authority has concluded in its draft decision that the complaint case is rejected, see Appendix 1 and 2.

IMY and the other CSAs raised no objections to the decision. Against that background, pursuant to Article 60(8) of the GDPR, IMY is required to adopt that decision.

How to appeal

If you want to appeal the decision, you should write to the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection. Please indicate in the letter the decision you are appealing against and the amendment you are requesting. The appeal must have been received by the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection no later than three weeks from the day you received the decision. If the appeal has been received on time, the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection will forward it to the Administrative Court in Stockholm for review.

You can e-mail the appeal to the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection if it does not contain any privacy-sensitive personal data or data that may be covered by confidentiality. The authority's contact details can be found on the first page of the decision.
